FLU AND COVID VACCINE UPDATE

For most people flu is just unpleasant but for some it can lead to more serious illness. The NHS provides a free flu vaccination for patients in the following categories:

- All those aged 65 years and over
- Those aged 6 months to under 65 years in clinical risk groups
- Household contacts of immunocompromised individuals
- Pregnant women
- Carers, those in receipt of carer's allowance, or main carer of an older or disabled person
- Children aged 2 and 3 years on 31 August 2023
- Frontline health and social care staff

In addition patients in the above groups are also eligible to receive an autumn covid booster vaccination.

Our vaccination clinics start in mid-September 2023. If you have received a text message invitation to make an appointment please click on the link, otherwise please contact Reception to make an appointment.

SHINGLES VACCINE UPDATE

To all our eligible patients, we will soon be planning to invite you to attend the practice for your shingles vaccination once the majority of our covid and flu clinics have completed.

Shingles is a common condition that can cause a painful rash. It can sometimes lead to serious problems such as long-lasting pain, hearing loss and sight loss.

You're more likely to get shingles and its more likely to cause serious problems, as you get older or have a weakened immune system.

The shingles vaccine helps to protect against shingles and its complications. As with previous campaigns run by the practice the current cohort of patients now eligible for the vaccine has increased from those aged 70-79 to those who turn 65 Years after 1st September 2023. Also included are those age 50 and over with a severely weakened immune system.
